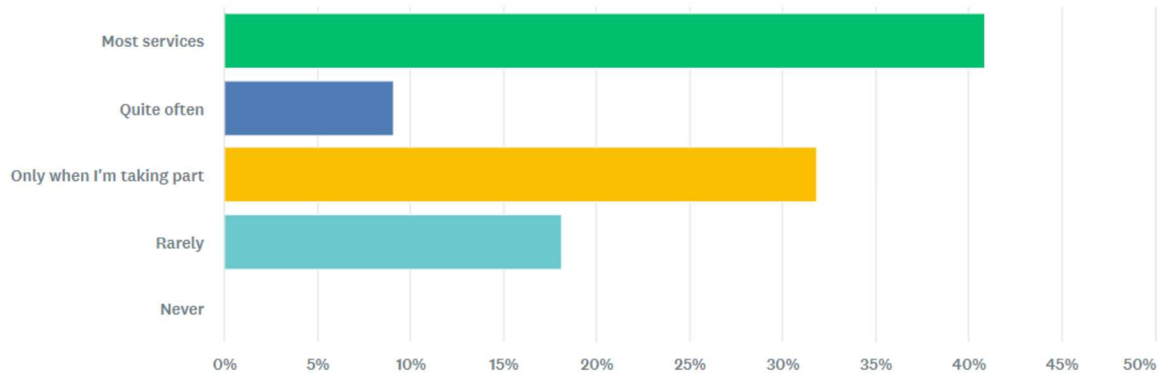


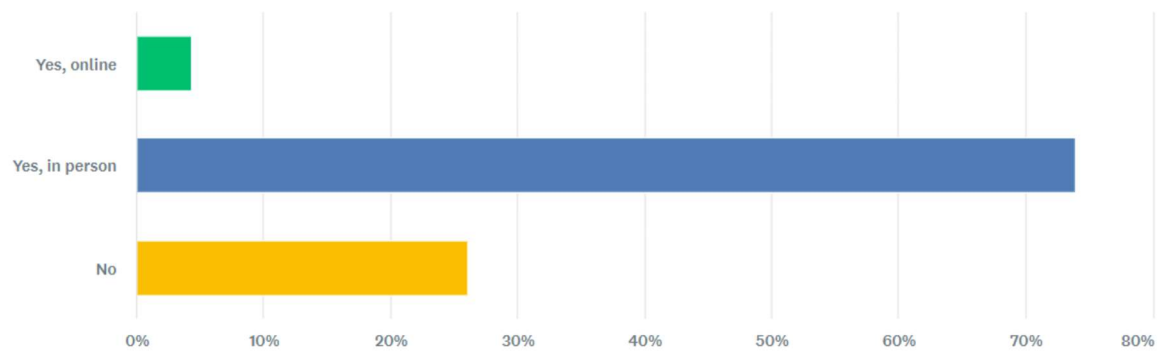
Thank you for answering our recent survey. You said you'd like to see the results, so here they are:

How often do you currently engage with our services?



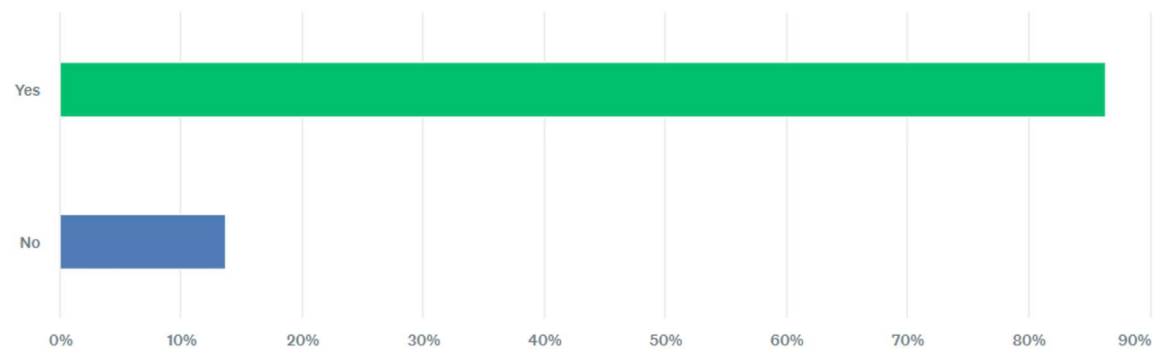
Of those of you who responded, about half of you join us for most services or quite often, which helps us read the following results in the light of "congregation members" as well as people who contribute who are more likely to respond to surveys in general.

Do you regularly attend any other church services?



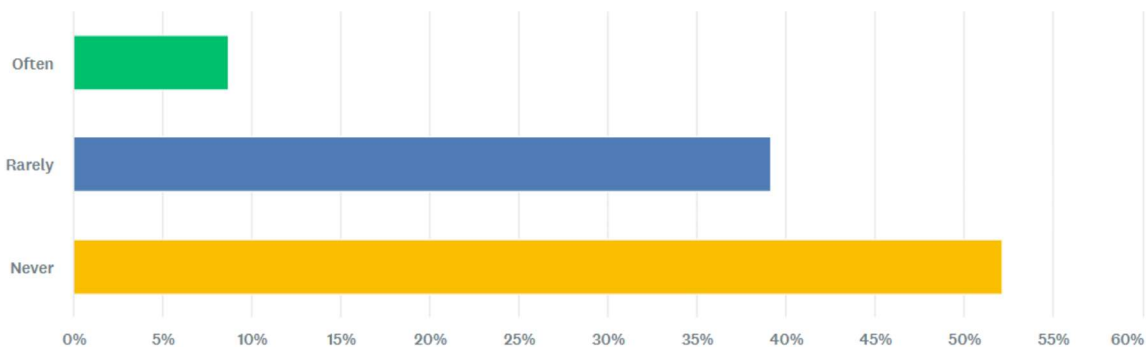
Most of you do go to in person services regularly, which is great, but it seems like we are the only form of church for over a quarter of you.

We are aware that the need these services fulfil has changed over the years, do you still think they serve a purpose?



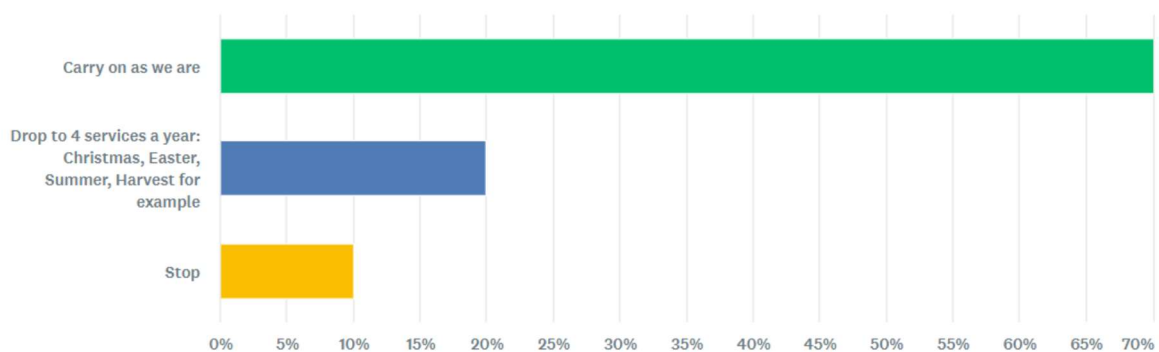
You do still think they serve a purpose, for those who can't or prefer not to attend in person services.

Do you watch the old services that we rebroadcast when we're away?



As we suspected, the old services are not that popular, but they are relatively low effort to broadcast so we will continue them for the few who do find them helpful.

Looking forward, how do you see the future of Virtual Church?



Most of you feel we should carry on as we are, 2 suggested that we go back to weekly which unfortunately isn't practical at the moment.

One person asked if we can measure the congregation, this is a bit tricky to do, but in general most weeks we have Youtube viewers in the teens or low twenties and Facebook claims views between 80 and 120, unfortunately facebook will count someone who only watches for 5 seconds in the same way as someone who watches the whole service. Youtube is much more reliable! In addition we have no way of knowing how many people may watch in a single household.

One person asked if we could extend the reach and/or hold a service at a different time. We have never really advertised these services as such, we've just trusted that they find the people who may need them. Having said that, we're not opposed to extending the reach if anyone has any particularly bright ideas! As far as the time, the people who value the live aspect of the service are those who don't/can't go to in person church so we wouldn't want to move far from the Sunday spot.

Another person suggested broadcasting a service from an in person church. We didn't ask about this on this survey, but from previous results people generally valued that we are a service

designed specifically for those at home, and everyone can participate in broadly the same way rather than simply watching other people "do church" in a more conventional way.

Lots of you took the time to thank us - we appreciate that!

Thank you all for your responses and your interest, in summary, the live services are still watched and valued by enough people so we will be carrying on as we are for the time being.
